

Pupil Premium – Website Report 2015

Please find set out below commentary on how Preston School has allocated Pupil Premium monies for the Year 2014-2015.

After discussion at Governing Body level it was agreed that the allocation of pupil premium monies should ensure maximum impact across the school impacting on a more broader socially disadvantaged population rather than a far narrower group defined by free school meals entitlement or whether or not in care.

It is also worth bearing in mind that Preston School has always deployed resources where best they are needed, both efficiently and effectively. Our most recent Ofsted report highlights the excellent progress vulnerable groupings are now making with the resources, staffing and curriculum that is now available to them.
