
### Sporting Success



## Student Support

Lesley Perry and Karen Talbot are our in house Student Support Officers – or SSO for short. We thought we would take this opportunity to introduce these ladies and show you what they do for the school.

Q – What do you do?  
 ‘We support the students that come in and look after any issues. We also take care of all C4 exits. Not only that, we support behaviour emotionally, anger, tears, but we do it with humour. We take care of lost property, make-up and uniform. It is a calm space to go if students are angry or upset. We also support all students who have too many negatives’.

Q - What does C4 mean?  
 ‘A C4 means they are exited from their class and come to us for the rest of the lesson, we then deal with the fall out (tears, anger, frustration etc) we talk through what went wrong and get them back to their learning. They have to attend a lunchtime detention as their sanction for getting a C4 and we have a

rota of staff who take these including Mr Morrison’.

Q - How long have you done this type of job?  
 ‘Karen its 12 years and me 10 years, so we have heard all the get outs, traumas, etc etc. bomb proof!’

Q - What sort of issues can the students bring to you?  
 ‘Anything and everything, we have smiles, laughter, tissues and chocolate just about most things to make the day better. We especially love it when lost property is reclaimed. We don’t like smelly PE kit in our office for too long. At the moment we have a large number of coats who are sad that their owners have lost them’.

Q - Do they make an appointment to see you?  
 ‘No appointments are necessary, everyone is welcome to pop in

at break and lunch if they need a word’.

Q – What’s the best part of your job?  
 ‘Working as a team, also working with the students. It’s is also such a good job because every day is different – you never know what the da brings’.
